Personal Value Statement on Service

To me, service is not just about me doing things to help others; it is getting the whole team involved and motivating them to also serve. My teenagers and I ended up spending a couple of hours spreading the rocks for her and pouring the bags of topsoil into the big flower pots that she had in front of her porch. Then, we discovered that she had planned to weed another rock bed so that it looked neat and clean. We could not let her do that all by herself, so we stayed and did that, too. At the end of the day, I was grateful for the opportunity to serve my neighbor and to set a good example for my own children. I believe I can also bring this same commitment to service to your company and not only serve your customers but also motivate my coworkers to serve better.
